





LIMITED EDITION



For the first time in the history of the Festival, the Limited Edition Fine Art Print is a dynamic, interpretive fine art photograph. "Woodruff's on Gay Street: Knoxville, TN" taken by local photographer, Phil Savage, is a panorama of the old historic Woodruff's building on Gay Street. Approximately 15 different shots from a wide angle lens were "sewn" and merged. The resultant distortion creates a heroic image making reference to the history and the "Renaissance" of downtown Knoxville. The photograph is copyrighted by the Dogwood Arts Festival, reproduced, numbered and signed by the artist.

Phil was born in Mexico City, Mexico, growing up in South America, and traveling around the world before he was brought to East Tennessee by native Knoxvillian, and fellow "Hall of Famer", Ginger Temple Baxter to help her coach gymnastics. Phil settled into Knoxville where he met his wife Lisa. The Savages have been teaching and coaching children in gymnastics at Premier Athletics since 1980. Phil's quiet, life-long passion with photography, influenced at an early age by his creative parents, led to his acceptance into the elite photography department at Southern Illinois University where he received his B.A. in Fine Art Photography in 1980.

HISTORY OF STREET PAINTING:

Thought to have originated in Italy in the 16th century, street painting is a growing event at many community festivals. Originally, the artwork was of a religious nature, therefore the artists were called, "Madonnari". Vagabond artists would travel throughout Italy between festivals living solely on the coins tossed onto or next to their drawings as homage to the Madonna or possibly to their abilities. For centuries the Madannari were true folk artists, but suffered a decline after World War II.

Dogwood Arts Tree-Planting Program To Restore Dogwood Tree Population



Dogwood Arts Festival has initiated ambitious plans for a community-wide tree-planting program to produce a "bazillion" dogwood blooms in the next three years. The "Bazillion Blooms" campaign is a major effort to plant disease-resistant, April-blooming dogwood trees in Knox and surrounding counties.

Individuals can purchase one of a bazillion blooms that we need to bring back East Tennessee's much-loved dogwood. The dogwood tree is vital to East Tennessee's economy, environmental health and heritage. It is a source of community pride and tradition. The goal of Bazillion Blooms is to restore dogwoods to their former vitality in Knox and surrounding counties.

Over the years, local dogwood tree populations have dwindled due to disease, construction and development, and neglect. The Dogwood Arts' Bazillion Blooms aims to reverse that trend through a multifaceted effort that will involve raising community awareness of care and protection of dogwoods, supporting neighborhoods and individuals who plant trees and spearheading large-scale tree plantings.

Donations of \$5 per bloom and \$100 per tree are being accepted at www.dogwoodarts.com to raise fund to purchase dogwood trees.

Bazillion Blooms is a collaborative effort between many organizations and volunteers. The Dogwood Arts Festival is working in partnership with the City of Knoxville, Knox County, UT Agricultural Department, state and local government agencies, local businesses and community organizations.
